

Moments in CRFUMC History

Although the women's groups of our church have evolved over the past 150 years, they have always been a vital presence in our church history. From the 1974 history pamphlet, we read:

"In addition to numerous dinners and bazaars held, and cultural events sponsored, the activities of the women have ranged from wielding mops and paintbrushes to using their artistic skills in crafts and needlework. Individuals have contributed their talents by teaching Church School and Daily Vacation Bible School, doing clerical work, and taking part in the vocal and instrumental music for worship services and programs."

The Ladies' Aid formed in 1885 and began keeping records in 1888. Over the next 20 years, 119 members are listed in the record books of that time. "Sociables" were held on holidays and on other occasions, at which games and such pastimes as sewing bees, apple-paring bees, spelldowns, and speaking pieces provided the entertainment. These social events were well attended since they were usually the only diversions of those days, other than neighborly visits and lodge meetings."

In the early years, "Many custodial duties of the church were performed by the ladies before there were paid janitors, and a number of improvement and redecorating projects were undertaken [including] putting Christographs on church windows, cleaning the well at the parsonage, and helping pay for installing acetylene gas lights in the building. The society sometimes contributed to the salary of the pastor and paid bills for repairs to church property."

Beginning in 1940, women's groups across the country embraced a new title: Women's Society of Christian Service (WSCS). In 1972-73, The United Methodist Women (UMW) came into being, followed by a new name in 2022, United Women in Faith.

Within the walls of our own church, various circles and small groups continued to support missions, participate in worship and Christian education, and create fellowship and support for one another. These groups have included circles for Service, Worship, and Friendship as well as the Today Circle, the Morning Circle, and the Study Group. Over the past 25 years, our women's groups have met as Leah Circle and Love Circle.




Tuesday 9:30 a.m. Bible Study

Question Jesus Asked A Six-week Study in the Gospels Magrey R. DeVega



Stephen Ministry

A Stephen Ministry Story

I was 26, newly divorced, living far away from family and friends, and dealing with a lot of guilt, shame, and low self-esteem. Was I a total failure? Would anybody ever want me? Was God condemning me because of my divorce?

I found a new church and made some friends, but still struggled. It seemed like all my church friends were perfect, happy, and full of faith—while I was flawed, gloomy, and full of doubts. When I shared some of this with my pastor, he suggested a Stephen Minister.

Before I met my Stephen Minister, I was worried she would judge and reject me once she learned about my past and got to know the real me. But she didn't. She was patient, loving, and accepting. I truly believe she was sent by God just for me. We got together weekly. She'd ask me questions, get me talking, and then listen as I shared my struggles and doubts. She showed me God's love even when I didn't feel it.

Over time, her faithful care helped me to see that perhaps I wasn't such a terrible person after all. Through her loving care, I began to think that if God loved me, then maybe I could love myself too. After a while, I got to a better place emotionally, and our Stephen Ministry relationship ended. A few years later, I remarried and had a miscarriage, and she was there for me again as a Stephen Minister, providing the care and support I needed. We now live over a thousand miles apart— but she will always hold a special place in my heart.

If you're dealing with any kind of difficulty, if you're struggling with faith questions or doubts, if you're wondering whether you are a worthy person, then I encourage you to consider getting a Stephen Minister. It just might be that God already has a special one picked out just for you.
